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PREFACE

Sacred Heart College (Autonomous), Thevara, Kochi, is a first grade college affiliated to the Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam, in Kerala. The college was established in 1944 by the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI), an indigenous religious congregation. It is the first CMI venture in the field of higher education. The college pursues the goal of holistic formation – nurturing the body, mind and soul with a social perspective - of the wards under its care, with unflinching devotion.

The college was accredited at the 'five star' level by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in the year 2000 and re-accredited in the third cycle with 'A' Grade in 2013. The college is in the process of its fourth cycle of accreditation. It is one of the few colleges in the state which have been enjoying the status of 'College with Potential for Excellence' (CPE) since 2004. Ever striving for academic excellence, harmonising the spiritual and the secular, the college has maintained high standards in curricular and co-curricular spheres. In recognition of its enviable achievements since its inception, the Government of Kerala conferred Autonomous Status to the college in 2014. SH is consistently on the quality front with consecutively in the top 60 for the last four years of national ranking by NIRF. The college runs hostels for boys and girls, where rooms are available for a limited number of students.

East Campus:

Giving wings to its ambitions to become a world-class academic institution, the Sacred Heart College is building up a new campus with state-of-the-art infrastructure. In addition to offering conventional programmes, the new campus is envisaged as a hub of frontier disciplines that address the needs of the emerging world. The East Campus will start functioning in the academic year 2020-21 with one PG and eight UG programmes.

Online Admission Process:

The college offers 21 Under Graduate, 18 Post Graduate and 7 PhD programmes. Applications for admissions to the Integrated M.Sc Computer Science (Data Science) programme during 2020-2021, shall be online. Under the Online Admission Process (OAP), applicants need to submit only ONE APPLICATION FORM. The allotment of seats to a given programme depends on his/her academic record and other norms of inclusion. The marks/grades secured by a candidate at the +2 level will decide the eligibility for admission to the Integrated M.Sc Computer Science (Data Science) programme, unless otherwise specified.

The Integrated M.Sc Computer Science (Data Science) OAP Prospectus - 2020 provides the complete information about the online admission process and the details of the programmes.

ATTENTION

Candidates should go through the prospectus carefully and acquaint themselves with all the relevant information relating to the admission process. They are also requested to visit the official website of the college <u>www.shcollege.ac.in</u> for detailed information.

This prospectus is subject to modification/addition/deletion as may be deemed necessary by the College.

The whole process of admission to the Integrated M.Sc Computer Science (Data Science) Programmes will be done by Sacred Heart College (Autonomous) Kochi, independently of the CAP of Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam.

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IMPORTANT POINTS

- □ Applications for admission to Integrated M.Sc Computer Science (Data Science) for the academic year-2020-21 should be <u>submitted online</u> on or before the last date stipulated in the admission schedule.
- □ Online registration can be done by accessing the college website <u>www.shcollege.ac.in</u>
- Community quota is limited to candidates belonging to Roman Catholic Syrian Catholic (RCSC), (Syro-Malabar) church and should be indicated in the space provided under 'Category' and such seats shall be filled on the basis of merit, provided the candidates in this regard have made the required entries regarding their respective community.
- □ Payment of application/admission fees can be made through any branch of South Indian Bank or by Debit card/Credit card/Internet banking.
- □ Verify your personal as well as academic details carefully before final submission.
- □ Once the 'Final Submission' has been made, no modification of data will be possible.
- □ Fake registration by any person / institution will be viewed seriously and will be liable for punitive action.
- □ After submission of the application, the candidate shall note down the application number and maintain a copy of the online application for all future reference.
- □ Candidates claiming reservation/bonus marks should produce relevant certificates during the verification process.
- □ Candidates seeking admission in the General / Community quota NEED NOT send/submit the print out of the online application to the college.
- However, those applying under Management / Sports / Cultural / PD quota should submit or send a copy of the online application, along with the self-attested copy of the relevant certificates specifically mentioning the quota under which admission is sought, addressed to "ADMISSIONS, Sacred Heart College, Thevara, Kochi- 682013" so as to reach the addressee before the last date and time of submission notified.
- □ Verification of Original documents will be done by the college at the time of admission.
- □ Applicants for Community quota should produce a letter from the parish priest at the time of admission.
- \Box Application for management quota may be downloaded from the admission portal after the final submission of the online application. The same may be submitted personally at the college office along with the processing fee of Rs. 500/-.
- □ Candidates under PD quota/SC/ST quota/Cultural quota/Sports quota should submit relevant certificates mentioned in the prospectus at the time of admission.
- □ All candidates who secure allotment should report for admission at the college complete the admission process by submitting the original certificates and paying required fees. Those who fail to report will be treated as 'Not Joined' and shall forfeit their allotment.
- □ Applicants should report for admission at the college with the downloaded admission memo. Candidates can view the status of their application and allotment by accessing the 'Application Status' link on the college website. No memo will be sent by post from this office in any case.

□ Hostel facilities: There are a limited number of vacancies in the college hostels for both Men and Women. The college has also networked with select hostels in the neighborhood to provide accommodation for its students.

If seats remain vacant even after the second special allotment, spot admission based on merit will be made from among the eligible candidates who have applied for the same in the college with prior notification on the college website.

2.CLASSIFICATION/CATEGORIZATION OF SEATS

The seats available in the college are mainly classified as Merit seats, Community seats and Management seats.

3. RESERVATION OF SEATS

A. AIDED PROGRAMMES:

3.1 Types of Reservation - Out of the total Merit Seats available in the college under M.Sc Computer Science (Data Science) Programme, seats will be reserved for different categories under the following main items.

- i. Reservation for International Students
- ii. Reservation for nominees
- iii. Reservation for Persons with Disabilities
- iv. Reservation for Transgender candidates
- v. Special Reservation and
- vi. Mandatory Reservation
- vii.

i. Reservation for International Students 10% additional seats shall be created in the college over and above the sanctioned strength and added to the total merit seats exclusively for the purpose of accommodating international students. These seats shall not be filled up with other candidates. The students who seek admission in this category should first apply online and submit the application number to the college

ii. Reservation for Nominees: An additional seat for each programme in the College shall be created exclusively for the purpose of accommodating **students sponsored by the Union Territory of Lakshadweep**. This seat shall not be filled up by other candidates. **Such applicants should apply directly to the college office.**

iii. Reservation for Persons with Disabilities (PD): 5% of the seats for all programmes, over and above the allotted strength are reserved for candidates with disabilities. Such seats shall be reserved for each of the three sections of Persons with Disabilities category (Blind, Deaf and Orthopaedically Challenged) with provision for interchange of seats, if candidates are not available in a particular category in a year. The selection of candidates under this category will be based on the rank in the inter-se merit list and physical suitability, and not on the basis of the degree of disability. 'Person with disability' means a person suffering from not less than 40% of any disability as certified by a Medical Board constituted for this purpose. Candidates who have a minimum of 40% disability alone will be eligible for this quota. A relaxation of 5% of marks in the qualifying examination from the prescribed minimum is allowed.

Candidates seeking admission under PD category should attach to their application form, an attested copy of the 'Certificate of Disability' issued by a District Medical Board or bodies of higher status, certifying the degree or percentage of disability.

iv. Reservation for Transgender candidates: Two seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength in all courses in the Colleges exclusively for admitting Transgender students. (G.O.(Ms)No.153/2018 HEdn dated 03.07.2018). However such students should also apply online and submit the application number to the college

v. Special Reservation: The seats reserved under Sports Quota and Cultural Quota come under this category. These seats shall be allocated from open merit seats.

a) Sports quota: Two seats under each programme (Interchangeable) shall be reserved for candidates with outstanding records in sports & games. The applicant for admission to the Sports quota should have represented at least the District Sports Zone.

Preference shall be given to Sportsmen who have represented the State/National School Meet. The applicant shall produce the relevant certificates to prove District representation.

The following guidelines shall be followed in determining merit in sports for admission to the Integrated M.Sc Computer Science (Data Science) programme. Marks shall be awarded to the First (Winner or the Winning Team), Second (Runner up or Runner up team), Third (third place) and participation as detailed in Table 3-1.

a) Minimum eligibility for admission of a candidate oundergraduate programmes (Sports Quota) is representation of a district in the State Championship in addition to his/her satisfying academic eligibility.

For securing admission to Integrated M.Sc Computer Science (Data Science) programme under Sports Quota, the performance of the candidate at 11th and 12th standards alone will be considered.

b) Cultural Quota: - One seat for each degree programme (Interchangeable) shall be reserved for students who excel in Youth festival recognised by Director of Public Instruction (DPI). The selection shall be made from among the applicants for the cultural quota on merit as detailed in Table 3-2.

If vacancies arise due to discontinuation of candidates under Sports/Cultural/PDquotas, the next eligible candidate in the Rank List shall be admitted. In case there is no next eligible candidate, the vacant seat shall be merged with the general merit quota.

vi. Mandatory Reservation:-

The seats for each programme will be distributed as per the existing pattern given in Table 3-3.

The seats under **community quota shall be reserved for students of the Roman Catholic Syrian (RCSC) community** and such seats shall be filled on the basis of merit.

The seats under **management quota shall be filled by the management** from among candidates of their choice.

The open quota seats will be filled purely on the basis of merit irrespective of the category/community to which the candidate belongs.

4. CLAIMS FOR MANDATORY RESERVATION AND CERTIFICATES TO BE PRODUCED

Claims for Mandatory Reservations must be made by a candidate at the time of submission of application, with supporting documents as required. The claims for **mandatory** reservation once made in the Application form cannot be altered by the candidate under any circumstances.

4.1 Claims for Reservation under Kerala Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota: Candidates claiming reservation under Kerala Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota should obtain caste/community certificate from the Village Offices concerned.

4.2 Other General Rules for Mandatory Reservation: The seats unavailed by the SC candidates will go to ST candidates and vice versa. The unavailed seats reserved for SC/ST shall be re-notified twice through print media and a special allotment shall be conducted exclusively for filling up vacant seats of SC/ST candidates. If such seats are remaining vacant even after re-notification, these shall be filled as detailed below:-

A. The unfilled seats shall be filled up from candidates belonging to OEC and in their absence, candidates belonging to SEBC. The seats that further remain unfilled will go to the open quota.

B. Claim of OEC candidates against the un-availed seats of SC/ST candidates: Other Eligible Community (OEC) candidates who claim allotment to the un-availed seats, if any, under SC/ST quota should furnish community and income certificates obtained from the Village Officer concerned.

6. PREPARATION OF RANK LIST

The Rank List shall be prepared on the basis of ranking marks arrived at as follows:

6.1 A handicap of 5 marks for every successive attempt after the first attempt subject to a maximum of twenty marks will be deducted from the total marks in the case of those who have taken two or more chances to complete the examination. The number of chances means the number of chances taken for passing any part of the qualifying examination after the prescribed programme period. Appearance for improvement of marks shall not be considered as an additional chance.

6.2 No handicap marks for SAY (Save a Year) pass outs shall be imposed if admitted in the same academic year, but five marks shall be deducted if he/she is ranked in the admission list of the succeeding year. Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination under SAY scheme or such supplementary scheme are eligible to apply for First Year programme in the same academic year, but they have to produce the mark lists on or before the closing date of admission as notified by the college.

6.3 Resolving of Tie

If the index marks of more candidates happen to be the same, then for breaking the 'tie', the following criteria shall be followed one after another in the order given below:

1. The candidate who has scored higher marks in the concerned elective subject shall be placed senior in the rank list.

2. The candidate who has scored higher marks for Part III Subjects (or the Subjects other than Languages, if Part is not specified) taken together shall be placed senior in the rank list.

3. The candidate who has scored higher marks in Part I (English if Part is not specified) shall be placed senior in the rank list.

4. The candidate who has scored higher marks in Part II (Second Language if Part is not specified) shall be placed senior in the rank list.

5. By giving residential weightage (at District/State Levels)

6. Preference shall be given to candidates who are elder, and the age difference shall be calculated in completed years only, rounding off fractions. (As candidates having difference in age less than one year happen to be admitted in the same class).

6.4 Bonus Marks

The Bonus Marks will be awarded as follows:

1. Bonus of 15 marks shall be awarded to applicants with NCC (National Cadet Corps) or NSS (National Service Scheme) Certificates at **'Plus Two level'** for admission to all programmes. In respect of NCC candidates, the bonus marks will be awarded on the basis of NCC Certificates signed by the Director and issued by the Directorate of NCC to candidates who have secured at least 75% attendance after having participated in its activities during the programme of study **immediately preceding the programme for**

which admission is sought. <u>An additional bonus mark of 3 will be given to 'A' Certificate holders</u> in proof of their high proficiency.

2. In respect of NSS candidates, the bonus marks will be awarded on the basis of NSS Certificates issued by the competent authority.

3. Bonus of 15 marks shall be awarded to the Ex-servicemen applicants and widows and children of Jawans and Ex-servicemen seeking admission to the Integrated M.Sc Computer Science (Data Science) Programme. Applicants to this category should invariably produce along with the application form an attested copy of certificate issued not earlier than six months from the last date of submission of application from the military authorities or state/Zilla Sainik Welfare Officer to the effect that he/she is the son/daughter of an ex-service man or an ex service man himself/herself.

a. The benefit of bonus marks can be availed by a candidate only under one category i.e., either NSS or NCC.

b. Bonus marks shall be added only if the candidate has obtained the prescribed minimum

qualifying marks in the qualifying examination while calculating the index marks.

6.5 Indexing of Marks

7. ONLINE ADMISSION PROCESS (OAP)

The applicants need to submit only a single application for applying online for admission to all the Integrated M.Sc Computer Science (Data Science) Programme in the college in the Open/Reservation Quota (sports quota/cultural quota and Persons with Disabilities (PD) quota. Lakshadweep quota: Candidates seeking admission through Lakshadweep quota should apply directly to the college. They can also apply under the Online Application Process, if they are to be considered for general allotment, in which case the selection will be based on merit/community quota.

APPLICATION FEES

For all applicants except SC/ST : 500/- (including processing fee of 300/-) For SC/ST candidates : 150/- (including processing fee of 100/-)

7.1 Remittance of Fee and Submission of Applications

Submission of application i.e. registration of personal and academic data as well as options for programmes shall be done **on-line**. Before submitting the application, candidates are advised to verify the **details of academic programmes in the college including hostel facilities through the website of the college**, in addition to the information given in this prospectus. Before selecting a programme the applicant shall ensure that he/she possesses the prescribed qualifications for applying for the programme.

7.2 Steps for On-line Registration

- 1. For online registration, the candidates must visit the web page, <u>www.shcollege.ac.in/admissions/</u>
- 2. Once the link is open click on "**New Registration**" button and enter the registration details carefully and "submit".
- 3. On submission, a unique Password will be send to your email and mobile immediately.
- 4. Follow the instructions for remittance of Applications Fee. (Payment can be made by directly through the bank (South Indian Bank only) /Debit card/ Credit card/Net banking.)
- 5. If you prefer payment through bank, generate a challan and take a print out.
- 6. Approach the nearest **South Indian Bank branch** along with the **Challan** print out and remit the required fee.
- 7. After remitting the fee, collect the challan copies from the Bank.
- 8. Failure to remit the application fees on time may result in your application being rejected.
- 9. Log on to your account using the User name (email ID) and unique Password.
- 10. Click on "Application Form" icon.
- 11. Fill in the Application Form with personal details, academic eligibility and the options correctly.
- 12. Candidates should click the "Save" button to save the entries made from time to time.
- 13. Verify with the relevant documents and confirm the details entered on-line.
- 14. Follow the instructions precisely before uploading your recent photograph.
- 15. After satisfying himself/herself that the details entered are correct, click on the "Final Submission" Button.
- 16. The application number will be allocated only on the completion of these steps.
- 17. Take a print out of the filled up application form for your future reference.
- Errors in the provisional rank list, if any, may be brought to the notice of the college office during the dates indicated in the admission schedule.

SPECIAL ATTENTION

After pressing 'Final Submission' button, no modification of data is possible. Hence, make sure that all entries are made correctly before 'Final Submission'.

Candidates seeking admission in the General / Community quota NEED NOT send the print out of the online application to the college. However, those applying under Management / Sports / Cultural / PD quota should submit/send a copy of the application specifically mentioning the quota under which admission is sought. Belated applications will be summarily rejected. Verification of original documents will be done by the college at the time of admission.

The Syllabus for the programme is the same as set by the MG University Kottayam, which will be published on the college website as and when it is made available by the University.

The programme is being offered on the basis of the government of Kerala initiative to grant new aided programmes to aided colleges, and its success will depend on the timely appointment of faculty members being sanctioned by the Government of Kerala.

As the proposed programme requires regular use of computers, additional fees for the same shall be charged for providing the same.

8. POST ALLOTMENT ACTIVITIES

8.1 Reporting at the College for admission:

All students who get allotment should report for admission at the college at the prescribed time. Those who fail to report on time will be treated as <u>NOT JOINED</u> and further claim for admission by these applicants will not be entertained. If travel restrictions are imposed on account of COVID 19, the admission process will be done online. The details of the procedures of the same will be given on the college website.

The candidates should produce the following documents in original at the time of admission.

- 1. Allotment Memo received online.
- 2. Challan of the admission fee remitted in the bank.
- 3. Certificate to prove date of birth.
- 4. Transfer Certificate (TC) from the institution last attended.
- 5. Conduct Certificate from the Head of the institution last attended (the conduct of the student shall be either be GOOD/ VERY GOOD or EXCELLENT).
- 6. Mark lists of all parts of the Plus Two / equivalent examination.
- Eligibility Certificate from Mahatma Gandhi University, in the case of candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from other Boards/Institutes/governments, except CBSE/CISCE
- 8. Migration Certificate, if applicable.
- 9. Medical certificate from a qualified medical practioner indicating the health status of the

candidate and his/her blood group.

- 10. Caste certificate in the case of SC/ST candidates.
- 11. UDID card, in case of person with disabilities
- 12. Any other document as required by the Head of Institution at the time of admission.
- 13. Community Certificate along with income certificate from the revenue authorities concerned, to the effect that the annual income of the family from all sources taken together is less than Rs. 6 lakhs in the

case of SEBC candidates who claim reservation under SEBC category. The income certificate should not have been issued earlier than 12 months prior to the submission of application.

14. Candidates shall produce the relevant certificates if they claim bonus/weightage of marks, if any.

The college authorities, after verifying the above documents, shall admit the student. The students who get admission should remit the fee applicable to the course in the institution at the time of admission.

8.2 Confirmation of Allotment

As the allotment is based on the information furnished online by the candidate, the eligibility should be confirmed at the time of admission. The principal shall verify the details furnished in the allotment memo in respect of the candidate by comparing the same with the original documents produced by the candidate. Any discrepancy shall result in the invalidation of the allotment and admission shall be denied to such candidates. The University shall verify the records produced by the candidates who got admission in due course and any discrepancy detected will lead to cancellation of the allotment.

9. SEATS AND FEE SCHEDULE

9.1 Candidates belonging to SC/ST communities who are allotted seats under merit or reservation category are exempted from payment of fee. Candidates belonging to OEC admitted against merit seats or against the un-availed seats of SC/ST are exempted from payment of fee (As per G.O.(Ms) No.14/2005/SCSTDD dated 5.4.2005 & G.O.(Ms) No.36/07/SCSTDD dated 03.07.2007

9.2 Claim for fee concession to OEC Candidates : Candidates belonging to Other Eligible Communities (OEC) are exempted from payment of fee at the time of allotment to Under Graduate Programmes irrespective of annual family income as per G.O.(Ms) No.36/07/SCSTDD dated 03.07.2007. They should provide Community Certificate from the Village Officer along with the Application Form, in order to avail this benefit.

9.3 SC/ST/OEC candidates will have to pay the 'Caution Deposit' as per rules.

RAGGING IS A CRIME

The "Honorable Supreme Court of India has directed that if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the student concerned shall be given liberty to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him/her from the institution.
