- To motivate the students to prepare their own webpage, app and add them in their profiles.







- To promote the students to attend the courses of NPTEL or Linda.com.






## MINUTES OF 3rd MEETING OF INTERNAL BOS

MINUTES OF INTERNAL BOS Regarding BCA Syllabus

Corrections in BCA Scheme and detailed syllabus

While scrutinizing the scheme and syllabus of BCA (Specialisation in Mobile Application and cloud Technology), we have found some errors. The following are the issues.

1. Change in internal and external marks division.
2. An additional course "Information Security Fundamentals" is included in the detailed syllabus which is not in the scheme.
3. One of the course allocated for the fifth semester as given in the scheme of programme is misplaced in the detailed syllabus of the 6th semester.
4. Two courses allocated for the 6th semester as given in the scheme of programme is also misplaced in the fifth semester.
5. The project work has not been mentioned in the detailed syllabus.

3. The <sup>open</sup> course "Security Threats and Trends" is given in 6th semester of detailed syllabus

4. The courses 'Mobile Ecosystem and Business Models' and 'Web Technology and Value Added Services in Mobile' is misplaced in 5th semester

The courses are to be placed in the detailed syllabus of sixth semester according to the scheme of programme.

5. The description of project work is not mentioned in the detailed syllabus

The detailed project work has to be included in the detailed syllabus of the 6th semester.

The above mentioned topics were discussed in the internal BOS meeting held on 19.07.17.

The corrections of the said errors were also discussed and planned to submit the amendments to the Academic Council.
