**Criterion III: Research, Innovation and Extension**

**1. Gift Thilapia Fish Farming Project -2018**

Bhoomithrasena Club of S.H. College has come up with a novel venture of culturing fresh, healthy and chemical free fishes in the campus. This venture started last year with the effective involved enthusiasm and cooperation of the CMFRI. The fish culturing of the previous year was a success and we managed to grow about 100 kilos of Thilapia fish.

**2. International Mangrove Day-Celebration**

The club members ventured out into the vast openness of the Nettoor backwaters which is famed for the local “Kandalkaadukal”, the mangroves.
