

## **REPORT**

The Department of English and Prajna foundation Kochi jointly organized training program for the faculty and research scholars. The theme of the training programme was Research Paper writing.

Principal Rev. Dr. Johnson X Palackappillil CMI inaugurated the training programme. In his inaugural address, Fr. Principal emphasized the importance of research paper writing in the academic research.

HoD Dr. C. S. Francis welcomed the participants and introduced the resource persons.

The first two days of the training was led by Prof. P. P. Raveendran, School of Letters, M. G. University Kottayam. A research paper is a piece of academic writing that provides analysis, interpretation, and argument based on in-depth independent research. Writing a research paper requires you to demonstrate a strong knowledge of your topic, engage with a variety of sources, and make an original contribution to the debate. Dr. Raveendran made a structured presentation on the topic for the two days on the following points:

- Understand the assignment
- Choose a research paper topic
- Conduct preliminary research
- Develop a thesis statement
- Create a research paper outline
- Write a first draft of the research paper

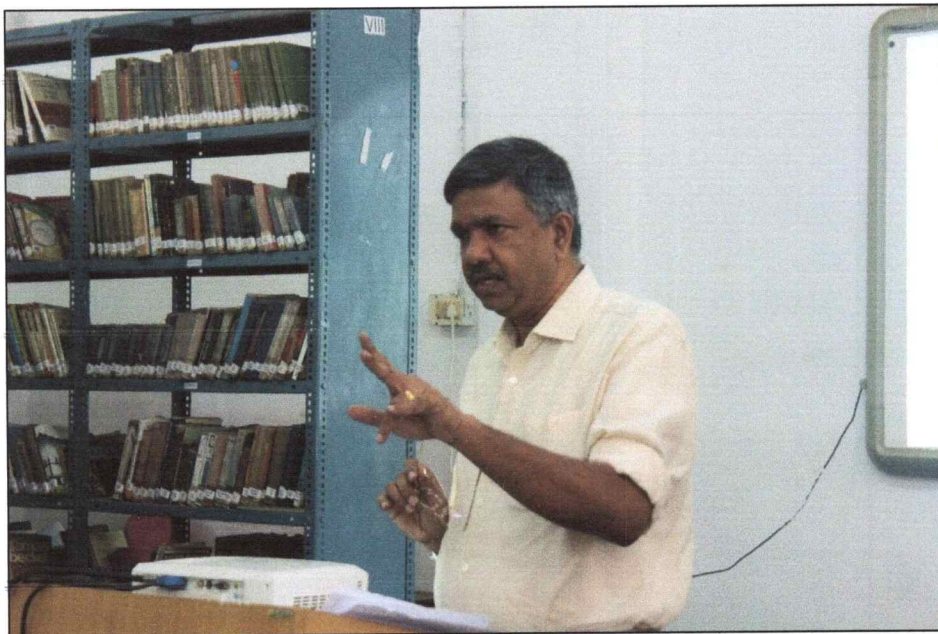
The next two days of the workshop was led by Mr. K. J. Jacob. He extended the training to new dimensions of academic writing and editing. He explained the writing of a compelling body of a text. The focus of the session revolves around the editing process of the draft of the research paper in the following points:

1. Checking the vision of the paper whether it lines up with the first draft still answers the assignment.
2. Identify the assumptions that might require (more substantial) justification, keeping the reader's perspective foremost in mind.
3. Be open to rearranging ideas.
4. Re-drafting with new ideas.

**Mr. K. J. Jacob Delivering the Session in the Training on Research Paper Writing (17/05/2018)**

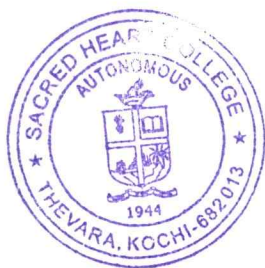
