PLANNING SESSIONS AT RAJAGIRI COLLEGE LED BY IQAC



A whole day was dedicated to a theme centered interaction workshop by Prof. Thomas Abraham that motivated everyone to become from a Teacher to Teacher Plus.


The five-day orientation was structured in such a way that it facilitated the participants with information regarding the academics as well as about the college as a whole

The resource persons for the workshop were **Prof. Subramanian and Dr. Anita Priya Raja from Gnanam School of Business Studies, Thanjavoor, Tamil Nadu**.

The two-day workshop was divided into different sessions in which the resource persons discussed about phsychometric assessments, experiential learning methodology and Revised Bloom's Taxonomy model. Various levels of RBT were explained by Prof. Subramanian. Its impact on student learning was also discussed. There was a session for management games.

Dr. Anita Priya Raja delivered the session on program objectives, program specific objectives and course outcomes. There was a department-wise group discussion and program specific outcomes were drafted. Each department representatives presented the drafted PSOs. The resource persons suggested modifications. The program enabled the faculty members to revise and modify the PSOs and Cos based on RBT model.

FACULTY ORIENTATION PROGRAMME ON NAAC REVISED CRITERIA AND RE- ACCREDITATION PROCESS

The IQAC of the college organized an orientation programme for the faculty members on NAAC revised criteria and re-accreditation process. The objective of the program was to familiarize the faculty regarding the revised NAAC criteria and the fourth cycle of accreditation.


Group Discussion & Presentation:

After the group discussion, one faculty representing each criteria presented the methodology and data collection. The ensuing discussion could modify and improvise documentation and data collection for the accreditation process.

NATIONAL WORKSHOP ON SPSS

Research and Post Graduate department of Commerce organized a three-day workshop on SPSS. The resource person for the workshop was **Dr. R. Kasilingam, Associate Professor, Department of Management Studies, Pondicherry University, Pondicherry**. He was the resource person for more than 80 training programmes on SPSS in different parts of India and abroad.



The first day started with sessions on fundamentals of SPSS. The discussions on types of variables and scales of measurement have been done. Sessions on introduction to SPSS, entering and manipulations of data, checking reliability and normality of data were delivered by Dr. Kasilingam. Second day started with a session on usage of various statistical tests based on the nature of data. Furthur discussion was focused on descriptive statistics and Chi-Square test. There were also demonstrations of different types of t tests. The final day of the symposium comprised of four technical sessions on exploratory factor analysis, correlation analysis and regression analysis. The participants could do a number of statistical analyses and Dr. Kasilingam clarified the queries on different aspects. Coordinator James V George proposed the vote of thanks.

FDP ON SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY OF EDUCATORS

Sacred Heart College Thevara organized a faculty development programme on the social responsibility of educators on 12 December 2018. The objective of the program was to inculcate the value of social responsibility in educators.

The resource person for this FDP was Principal Rev. Dr. Johnson X Palackappillil CMI. A renowned social worker by profession, Fr. Principal is a great proponent of social commitment of teachers.

In his session, the resource person examined the social responsibility of education through an explorative study on a sample of teachers and students. The results revealed that there are a lack of awareness of this phenomenon and more worthy, it's shown that teachers have to stimulate and inspire their students to be involved in social actions and demonstrate for them how to be good, conscious, and responsible. Teachers should promote some values that conduct the behavior of students. Fr. Johnson said that the objective of the FDP is to develop and establish an advanced social responsibility among the education team who will be responsible to transmit it to students and to community in whole. 46 Faculty members participated in the FDP. IQAC co-ordinator Dr. K. M. Johnson proposed the vote of thanks.



FDP ON BLENDED LEARNING AND FLIPPED CLASS ROOMS

IQAC of the college organized a faculty development programme on *Blended Learning and Flipped Class Rooms*. Blended learning is a broad term used to describe the combination of face-to-face and online delivery of teaching and learning. This FDP was aimed at inculcating the culture of blended learning and flipped class rooms among the faculty.



The technical session was delivered by Mr. Aravind R Nair, Assistant Professor in the Department of English. Mr. Aravind is an expert in the field of blended learning.

The resource person explained the following components of blended learning:

- Using multiple technologies and media to deliver content.
- · Providing social and emotional support
- Engaging students in dialectic and

questioning activities

- · Incorporating reflection and activities that require students to reflect on their learning
- Engaging in collaborative learning

Mr. Aravind also explained in detail about the aspect of flipped class rooms. He also motivated the participants to create a model class room and introduce the ideas of blended learning and flipped class rooms.

HANDS-ON TRAINING ON MICROSCALE PHYSICAL CHEMISTRY EXPERIMENTS

The Chemistry department of Sacred Heart College organized a one-day hands-on training in microscale experiments in physical chemistry. The objective of the training programme is to acquire expertise in environment friendly microscale experiments in chemistry. The program was organized in continuation of the Department's consistent efforts to introduce new techniques for improving the efficiency and reducing the usage of chemicals in Practicals.

The resource person **Dr. Jorphin Joseph** introduced the fundamentals and principles of microscale methods in chemistry. The practical sessions were held in the MSc Physical chemistry laboratory.


In the first session Two-burette titrations is demonstrated. Two very important physical chemistry Practicals were demonstrated in the second and third sessions. Partition coefficient experiment is normally not performed in laboratories due to the excessive usage of carcinogenic chemical carbon tetrachloride. Dr. Jorphin explained the microscale approach in doing this experiment which requires only very small volume of carbon tetrachloride.

The experiment of three-component system was also demonstrated using microscale approach.

The participants were faculty from department of chemistry. Department staff secretary thanked Dr. Jorphin for his excellent lab sessions.

FACULTY TRAINING ON E-CONTENT DEVELOPMENT

Sacred Heart College organized a Faculty training programme on E-content Development. The programme was aimed at making the faculty members well-versed in handling various ICT tools for teaching. Dr. Grace Thomas (Jt. Coordinator, IQAC) welcomed the audience. The whole faculty development programme was divided into two sessions. The first session was handled by Rev. Fr. Dr. Jose John CMI and the second session



was handled by Rev. Fr. Dr. Joseph Kusumalayam CMI. Both resource persons were actively involved in developing novel methods of teaching.

IQAC WORKSHOP ON OBE

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Sacred Heart College (Autonomous), Thevara, Kochi organised a workshop on Outcome Based Education (OBE) for college teachers on 3-4 May, 2019 in association with Kerala Higher Education Council. The two day workshop was inaugurated by Principal Rev. Fr. Johnson X Palackappillil CMI. The chief guest for the workshop Vice-Chairman of Kerala State Higher Education Council Dr. Rajan Gurukkal. In the inaugural address he brought clarity regarding Curriculum Redesigning Concepts and Challenges.

The technical sessions of the orientation programme were handled by Dr. Manulal P. Ram, Research Officer Kerala State Higher Education Council, Dr. Ajay K., Assistant Professor, Department of Geology, Government College, Kottayam. There were practical sessions on how to write Programme Outcomes, Programme Specific Outcomes, Course Outcomes, tagging course outcomes, Taxonomy of learning, attainment of COs, PSOs and POs, Tagging of Questions with COs and Taxonomy Table. Sessions were handled by. 58 teachers participated in the programme.
