
## One Day Orientation On The Code Of Conduct For Teachers 2016-2017

The teaching staff was also highly enthused by the comprehensive and wholesome counselling, which centred on various guidelines for mentoring and guiding the students, regarding various aspects of a student's life involving academic, personal, religious and moral matters. Extensive sessions were held with regard to the need to guide students on how to balance various aspects of his/her life with a healthy and a positive outlook, which is a pertinent matter that holds utmost importance in student life. A group discussion was held among the faculty members, following the counselling session, sharing the various benefits of such guidance and mentoring provided to the students. The formal sessions came to an end with a lunch break. The fifth session of the day was delivered by Fr Jose Thuravakal, CMI on how to be an inspiring model for students and inculcating in them humane and just values. It was an in-depth and an insightful session, encouraging the teaching staff to be significant guides and mentors in the lives of the students, and how they can act as a source of strength and inspiration to them. There was also a discussion on the need to instil important humane, ethical and just values so as to enable the students to become capable, responsible and sensitive youth of tomorrow.
