A session on the Code of Conduct for teaching faculty was held on June 3, 2017 at Sacred Heart College, Thevara, with the aim of fostering a clear conscience and moral integrity among teachers.

At 9:00 am the meeting commenced with a yoga and meditation session to refresh and invigorate the minds that have gathered for the event. After summoning a general air of calmness and peace of mind, at 9:30 am, Principal, Dr. Johnson Palakkappilil welcomed the teachers with an introductory remark. He emphasised the importance of the code of conduct to be maintained by the faculty on the campus. He said that not only in our dealings with others but even in the demeanour, the faculty should keep proper code of conduct. He emphasised the importance of campus ministry, counseling and mentoring to aid a holistic education to students. Further he emphasized the need of mentoring programme in reaching out to the families of students and their formation. He also urged the teachers to inculcate the *dharmic* values in students and encourage them to tread in the path of a life rooted in integrity, ethics and prudence.
