Age Friendly programme is based on the concept of University of Third Age United Nations of WHO. The college was declared the First Age Friendly Campus in March, 2016. Age Friendly is an initiative of Sacred Heart College that aims at providing free education to Senior Citizens. The programme is to equip senior citizens to live independently and strengthen their mental health, so that they can participate actively in various social activities. Making senior citizens a part of the college has helped them connect with the young generation. They engage with the students in various activities which reduces their isolation and dependency. The college offers the same privileges to senior students as that of the normal students of the college. Age Friendly students (senior citizens) getting education under this initiative are exposed to the real college atmosphere. They get exposure to all the activities of the college. A one-to-one learning system takes place in every classroom, where, an Age Friendly Volunteer teaches every Age Friendly student.' Teaching and knowledge- sharing between different generations is given utmost importance. Rather than a student- teacher relationship, a homely atmosphere is created between the students and the volunteers.
