Name of the Programme: Holy Books Reading

Name of the Programme: Hospital Visit

Category of the programme: Socioeconomic diversity

The program started by the initiative of College Jesus Youth in association with General Hospital. A group of 12 students visit the *Destitute ward, Isolation ward and cancer ward of General Hospital Ernakulum* every Saturday. The group is further divided into smaller groups of 3 or 4 and are assigned duties at kitchen, isolation ward or cancer ward. They switch their duties after about one and a half hours so that everyone gets a chance to help out in all the wards. The students engage **in serving and feeding the patients**, chatting with them, *listening* to them and entertaining them. The hospital visit gives the students a fresh *perspective of life* and makes them count the blessings they receive in their lives.
