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
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Display of Fundamental duties

1. Paper File - Display of Fundamental duties





Activity 3: Flood Relief

In the year 2018, Kerala had witnessed Flood in the month of August. Right from the beginning of the calamity, students of SH College, Thevara, were at the forefront of extending services at different parts of Ernakulum district and nearby districts. They were always at the call of the people in distress with their helping hands. These activities ensured that the staff and students of the College were part of the *national building process* as reconstructing Kerala after Flood. More than 100 volunteers including lady volunteers rendered services at any point of time through these days on a war footing basis. In some of the days the work was extended till the wee hours of night. Relief operations were mainly concentrated on three areas - services at relief camps, handling relief materials and cleaning of flood affected houses and institutions at Aluva and Alappuzha.



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

In association with Kerala Urban Road Transport Corporation Depot, which is located near the College, the NSS unit conducted a cleanliness drive at the centre. The Student volunteers took the initiative to clean the Depot and Volvo buses as part of maintaining public properties. While organizing this programme, students got an insight into the responsibility of promoting the fundamental duties to protect public places and properties





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Activity 5: Debate on Social issues

In order to facilitate the students to express their thoughts and speech the College moderates different programmes like public speaking, debate as part of club initiatives by *Speakers forum* (club) and NSS unit of the college. By participating in such programmes, students can enrich the public speaking skills, awareness on social issues and explore an open space for *expressing their ideas*. A debate was conducted on 13th August 2018 by volunteers of NSS unit and Speakers Forum. The topic chosen was "Inninte Yuvathwam Mounathilo" (Is the Youth of Today Silent?). Volunteers and students actively participated in the debate presenting their viewpoints.





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Activity 6: Talk on Disaster Preparedness by Murali Thummarukudy

The constitution of India envisages that the citizens should *protect* and improve the *natural environment* including forests, lake, rivers and wildlife and should cultivate compassion for living creatures. Every citizen has the responsibility to protect the nature. Inorder to bring awareness among students on the impact of natural disasters an awareness programme was conducted on **Disaster Preparedness** on 04th September 2018 at Sacred Heart College. The resource person was **Murali Thummarukudy**, **Chief of Disaster Risk Reduction in the** *United Nations* Environment Programme. The session focused on the measures taken to prepare and reduce the impact of disasters.

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
Activity 9: Republic Day Celebrations (26/01/2019)

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
