WORLD ZOOONOSES DAY | JULY 6

- Zoonotic diseases are infections that spread between animals and humans, such as nipah, rabies, COVID-19, Ebola, Lassa fever, bovine tuberculosis, and avian influenza.
- World Zoonoses Day, observed annually on July 6, commemorates Louis Pasteur's successful administration of the first rabies vaccine on July 6, 1885, marking a milestone in disease prevention.
- This day highlights the importance of vaccination, responsible animal care, food safety, and environmental hygiene in controlling zoonotic threats.
- It also promotes the One Health approach, which emphasizes collaboration between human, animal, and environmental health sectors to prevent future outbreaks and protect global health.
